Since the election carried in both districts the consolidation is hereby declared carried, with the sharing of outstanding indebtedness — to be known as School District N o. 79 and to become effective immediately.

Thus, according to the above, with the consolidation of School Districts No. 79 and 163, the boundaries of Union High School District No. 8 and the newly consolidated district No. 79 coincide.

THEREFORE, AS OF SEPTEMBER 3, 1954, UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 8, IS HEREBY AUTOMATICALLY DISSONVED and School District No. 79 shall become a unified district maintaining grade and high school. The School Board of Union High School District No. 8 shall serve as the School Board of the newly formed unified District No. 79 until the next annual school meeting, June, 1955, at which time a complete new board, consisting of three (3) members shall be elected.

Bill was presented from Percy W. Brown and Company, requesting partial payment in the amount of \$3778.50 for the audit of school district records for the school year ending June 30, 1954. Motion was made, seconded and carried, that the County Superintendent be instructed and authorized to draw an order on the County School Fund in the above amount.



THEREFORE, as of <u>July 13, 1950</u>, UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 13 IS HEREBY AUTOMATICALLY ABOLISHED AND SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 69 SHALL BE-COME A DISTRICT OF THE FIRST CLASS MAINTAINING GRADE AND HIGH SCHOOL.

Note: Even with School District No. 27 withdrawn from said Union High School District, Union High School District No. 13 is obligated to provide education for children of said District No. 27 for the school year 1950-51, since they are on the tax roll during said year (Chapter 13, Page 5, Oregon School Law Supplement 1949).

Dear Sirt.

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Purshant to your request we have perused the letter from the county school superintendent of Lens county, in which she presented certain cuestions concerning a proposed consolidation of a union high school district and a regular school district. As I understand the facts, school district No. 69, a regular school district, recently consolidated with adjacent elementary school districts so that its boundaries are now prectically coextensive with those of union high school district No. 13. It is the desire of the elementary school district and the union high school district to consolidate. However, the respective boundaries differ in this: First, the boundaries of school district No. 69 extend alightly beyond the e of school district No. 13 in that the said district includes teritory known as"North Lancaster". This territory, while it is a part of district No. 69 for elementary purposes, is also included within an adjacent union high school district which is known as Harrisburg union high school district. Second, union high school distriet No. 13 not only covers the territory of district No. 69 (with the exception above noted), but also includes another small elementary district known as district No. 27.

The county school superintendent presented the following questions, which we will answer in sumerical order:

"1. District No. 27 could be voted out of the Union High School district pursuant to Chapter 563, Oregon Laws of 1947. It would appear that this could be done by a majority vote in the high school district even though the voters in District 27 might be opposed to the plan. Is that correct?"

Chapter 563, Oreg n Laws 1947, amends certain sections of the code relating to union high schools and sets forth the procedure to be followed whenever it is desired to change the boundaries of such a school district by withdrawal of territory therefrom. Specifically it provides:

.....

states if a majority of the votes cast at such election be in favor of changing the boundaries of said union high school district by withdrawal of territory, the boundary board shall proceed to make the required change the second school of the school of

Assordingly, the statement presented in the foregoing question is sorrest.

It is also suggested thet, in order to invoke operation of Par. 4, chapter 393, Oregon Lazs 1949, elementary school district No. 27 could consolidate with district No. 69. Thereupon all districts within the union high school district No. 13 would be consolidated, and pursuant to the foregoing chapter the union high school district as such would be abolished and the area included therein would be a regular school district of the class as determined by its school census.

> *2. If that were done there would still be the slight difference in areas between the districts composed Horth Lancester, which is a portion of the elementary district but not a portion of the high school district. Would that area prevent the immediate consolidation of the high scholl and elementary districts^{***}

"In the instant case ell districts within the high school district would be consolidated even though some additional territory, North Langaster, was included in the elementary district. In that situation would the elementary and high school districts be consolidated? Would North Lancester then pay its full share of taxes to the consolidated district and else pay its taxes to the Union High school district, Harrisburg, of which it is a part?"

Chapter 393, Oregon Laws 1949, is an entirely new set relating to extension of courses in union high school districts. Section 4 thereof provides in part that:

> "**** when all districts within the union high school district are consolidated, the union high school district us such shall be abolished and the area included shall be a regular school district of class determined by its school consus. The union high school board shall continue as the board of such district until the next annual meeting when the proper number of board members shall be cleated for the class of district in which the district belongs. The term of all board members in all elementary districts. shall terminete at the time the union high

school board becomes the district school board as heretofore provided. All property and obligations of the individual districts included shall become the property and obligation of the newly constituted district unless it is otherwise provided where such district is forzed by consolidation."

As we interpret the foregoing shepter, when all elementary districts within the union high school district are consolidated the union high school district as such is abolished. Accordingly, the fact that a portion of the territory of one of the elementary districts extends beyond the boundaries of the union high school district does not alter the situation. It is to be observed, however, that in such event the elementary and high school districts are not "consolidated"; rather, the union high school district as buch is abolished.

As to the question of whether the territory known as "Morth Lancaster" would have to pay its full share of taxes to the consolidated district and also pay its taxes to the Harrisburg union high school district of which it is a part, this question must be answered in the affirmative. Upon the happening of the conditions mentioned in par. 4, chapter 393, Oregon Laws 1949, the North Lancaster territory would be in the anomalous position of being included within a regular school district maintaining both elementery and high schools, and also included within the Harrisburg union high school district for high school purposes. This office has held on several occasions in the part that such territory would still be liable for taxes for the maintenance of a high school in the regular school district. See par. 111-3103, 0.6.L.A.; Opinions of the Attorney General, 1936-1938, p. 463; 1946-1948, p. 521.

> "3. From the language quoted from Chapter 393, Laws of 1949, it would appear that the school hoard of the consolidated elementary and union high school districts would be composed of the union high school board until the next annual meeting. Is that so?"

This question is enswered in the affirmative.

"4. Your advice would be appreciated as to the best manner of straightening out the North Lancaster situation. Would North Lancaster, pursuant to Chapter 563, Laws of 1947, become a portion of Union High School District 13 by an election in Union High School District 13 and in North Lancaster without the necessity of an election in the entire Harrisburg Union High School District? If it did vote out of the Harrisburg District and into Union High School District 13, would it be entitled to apportionment of the assets and liabilities of Harrisburg Union High School District?"

As I understand the procedure suggested by this cuestion. the county school superintendent is suggesting that the territory known as North Langaster should be annexed to union high school district No. 13 and withdrawn from the Harrisburg union high school district. I can not see where this would accomplish the general purpose that has been set forth in the preceding questions. However. if it is desired to maintein the two union high school districts as such, then possibly the questions would have some merit. In mich event, I suggest that it would be advisable to hold an election first in the Herrisburg district upon the question of whether or not the Morth Lancaster territory should be withdrawn therefrom. Upon its withdrawal the said territory could then be annexed to the adjacent union high school district. While the law is not clear on this point, it appears to us that the territory could not be withd awn from one union high school district and added to another district of the same type without securing the approval of the voters of each particular district.

Concerning the last portion of this inquiry, par. 111-3144, O.C.L.A., as amended by chapter 563, Oregon Laws 1947, provides:

> "The withdrawal of territory from a union high school district shall not relieve the territory so withdrawa from limbilities for indebtedness previously contracted by such union high school district or affect the validity of any bonds theretofore issued by it."

The foregoing section is applicable in the event the North Lanonster territory is withdrawn from the Harrisburg union high school district.

It appears to us that it would be the best interests of the taxpayers of the North Lancaster territory to request withdrawal from the Harrieburg union high school district, in event a school district is formed pursuant to chapter 393, Gregon Laws 1949, for the reasons stated in our answer to the second question.

Mr. Reid: 1. A meeting and an election has been confused. A meeting does not have to have a closing date, but an election does. The time stated on the notices was legal for a meeting but not for an election.

- 2. Boundary Board has no authority to challenge a vote, therefore, they will have to count the Bower vote, making Oak Hill against.
- 3. The motion to throw the other three districts out was illegal. In view of the fact that taxes is to be levied and there might be a kick. To make it stick another election should be held.

Mr. Neilson: Is that the opinion of the Attorney General.

Mr. Bertelson: Mr. Neilson demanded that Mr. Bower vote. Is that legal?

Mr. Reid: The Boundary Board does not have authority to decide what is or is not legal.

Mr. Saunders: Who does have authority to inquire into this election?

Mr. Reid: The Circuit Court.

Superintendent: What should be done from now on. Should they put a closing time on the notices or not?

Mr. Reid: Proceed on the theory of an election. You can not hold an election and proceed on the theory of a meeting.

Mrs. Bertelson: Mr. Neilson and Mr. Bower do not have children and are not interest in the school, but only in the few pennies of taxes they would have to pay. The school is not fit for children.

Mr. Bertelson: They did not have a chance to be here. They would like to have a chance for their side to express its views. Mr. Reid: It makes no difference whether or not there is anyone here. This is just to decide if the Boundary Board did anything illegal. The Boundary Board is stuck with its decision. The time for it to do anything has expired. A new election should be held.

Mr. Saunders: No one knows what they are doing, including the School Superintendent, the Boundary Board, and the Attorney General. Mrs. Kennedy deliberately failed to give the districts correct information, fixed it so some did not get to vote, gave different sets of information to different people, posted illegal notices, donducted the election illegally, lied to him and others who wanted information about consolidating, was doing something crooked or would throw the election out, and gave incorrect information to the Attorney General to base his opinion on.

Mr. Reid: The School Superintendent and her office did nothing that was not perfectly legal. They acted on the authority of the District Attorney and the Attorney General.

Judge Hurd: Mrs. Kennedy was correct in everything she did.

Mr. Holland: Made a motion to stand on their previous opinion then the school districts can start over, and hold another election.

Mr. Wheeler: Wants to stand on the motion made when the votes were canvassed.

Mr. Reid: There should be a new election, then if it is contested they will be on firmer ground.

Superintendent: From now on is she to be instructed whether or not to put a closing time on the notices? Mr. Reid says he will give her a written opinion.

Mr. Neilson: They did not have correct information on the consolidation. He would like to have the opinion of Dr. C. L. Huffaker. It is his opinion Dr. Huffaker will be against it.

Superintendent: She will ask Dr. Huffaker's opinion.

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Dear Sir:

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In compliance with your request for our opinion as to the legality of an election for the consolidation of four school districts of the third class in Lone. County, we have reviewed the transcript of proceedings and certain compute of interested parties. Our conclusions are the following:

The notices of election were legally sufficient and were posted as required by law. They proparly stated the date of the meeting, including the time of beginning; and because of the question to be voted upon, their emission to state the time of closing the election was proper; section 111-532, 0. C. L. A. In an election for consolidation of school districts the election chairmen should not declare the voting alosed sor should the vote be counted until "all legally qualified voters have voted, if they so desire"; section 111-532, mpra.

The district boundary board canvassed the votes and found that allfour districts had returned affirmative majorities for consolidation. The beard and the county school emperintendent phould then have proceeded as directed by section 111-634. O. C. L. A.

It is not stated in the latter of the county school superintendent to you, regarding this election, that the chairman and tellors or judges of the election and the clorks of the respective districts failed to discharge their duties in connection with the election. The presumption of law is in favor of the regularity of their efficiel acts.

It is our opinion that the district boundary board can not declare an election invalid. The board is charged with the duty of canvasning the vote and announcing the result of the election; and this does not mean challenging the voters after they have cast their ballots. The convect is quantitative and not qualitative. The Supress Court of this state, with reference to the duty of the district boundary board in means to an election for consolidation, said in School District No. 1 v. School District No. 45, 148 Gr. 55h, 574:

* * * No discretion is vested in the said board in that respect. To consolidate districts when no such raturns of election have been made is illegal. It would be equally illegal to refuse to consolidate if returns were made showing a majority in each district in favor of such consolidation; or to refuse to declare the consolidation defeated if one of the districts be shown to have registered less than a majority in favor thereof."

To doclare invalid the election hold in any of the four districts is a judicial determination which can be made only by a court in an appropriate proceeding. An administrative board can not pass upon the legality of the acts of cortain electors or determine to what extent, if any, those acts affected the result of the election: 1930-199, page 333; Opinions of the Attoney General,

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Opinions of the Atterney General, /1938-1940, page 39. Pewer not granted by lim to the district boundary board does not exist: School District v. Palmer, 41 Gr. 485, 488; Hicklass v. Goodspeed, 56 Gr. 184, 187. See also 29 C. J. S., Elections, section 237, reading in part as follows:

"It is a common error for a canvassing board to overestimate its powers, but, since such a board is ordinarily a creation of constitution or statute, it may be stated generally that it has such powers and duties, and only such, as are conferred by the constitution or statute creating it, ... Unless authorized by constitutional or statutory prevision, they have no power to go behind the retorns and ascertain the qualifications of the roters or otherwise inquire into the regularity of the election. Frank, bribery, violence or other matters affecting the regularity of the elections are to be passed on by the proper tribusel and not by the board of canvassers. The canvassers are not sutherized to determine the legality of illegality of the votes cast at the election".

District Attorneys Opinions: A state time for the election.

- 2. The notices were O.K., they do not have to be signed as long as they informed voters of the issue and date of election.
- 3. The Boundry Board is to check and inquire into the matter of the election.
- 4. Canvass means to examine in detail; to scrutinize; to sift, therefore this matter is under their jurisdiction.

Mr. Bowers:

Challenges the right to vote of people whose name is not on the assessment rolls.

District Attorney:

Mr. Bowers can not vote after votes have been counted.

Mr. Neilson:

Other districts did not turn out because they believed Oak Hill would turn it down.

Mr. Saunders:

Maintains the time of closing the polls makes the election illegal.

District Attorney:

If there is sufficient number of illegal votes the Boundry Board has the right to declare the election illegal and throw it out. There will have to be a complete new petition and election.

Mr. Bowers:

Asked if Superintendent did not say that the election could not last over an hour, if it did they would know how the votes were going and go out and pack the ballot box.

Mr. Neilson:

7 P.M. voting for farmers is unreasonable.

Mr. Saunders:

School elections are usually at eight. Why was this one at seven?

Mr. Wheeler:

I make a motion, based on the fact that there was no stated time for the election to end, and therefore people who wanted to did not get to vote, that we throw out the election as illegal.

Mr. Holland:

I second the motion, because some people who were entitled to vote did not get to.

Mr. Neilson:

Wants to split Fir Butte and Oak Hill District. Was told he would have to submit a petition to the Boundry Board.





MINUTES OF BOUNDARY BOARD MEETING

Special meeting of the District Boundary Board of Lane County, Oregon, present, Clinton Hurd, County Judge, Chairman; C. M. Young and Walter J. Holland, County Commissioners; and L. C. Moffitt, County Superintendent, Clerk.

Whereupon the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

"WHEREAS, petitions that the following school districts be united and organized into a Union High School District, to-wit:

> That part of Cloverdale No. 2 not included in Union High School District No. 1;

Creswell, No. 40 Howe, No. 42 Upper Camas, No. 63 Bear Creek, No. 162 Camas Swale, No. 178

have been heretofore filed with the District Boundary Board, and notice given for a hearing on this date all of which has been examined and found regular and according to law and

WHEREAS, remonstrances from two of the districts have been filed with the District Boundary Board and found by the Board to be signed by a sufficient number of legal voters in each of said two districts,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE DISTRICT BOUNDARY BOARD hereby orders and directs the respective school boards of the above named districts proposed to be united, including the school board of the district where a part of the district is proposed to be united, to submit to the legal voters of each of said regular school districts and to the legal voters residing in that portion of District No. 2 not included in Union High School District No. 1, the question of forming a Union High School District to be composed of the foregoing school districts and part of school district, which election shall be called in and conducted by the regular school boards of each district at the school house of its respective district or at a place designated by the school board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the District Soundary Board hereby calls a special election to be hald in the various diar tricts and part of district on Wednesday, the 20th day of March, 1940, at 8 o'clock P.M. of said day for the purpose of subsitting the question of the formation of a Union High School District of the foregoing districts and part of district and for the further purpose of electing five directors to serve as the Union High School District Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the District Boundary Board be and he is hereby required to forward notice of this order and resolution to the district boards of each of the districts proposed to be united."

Special meeting of the District Boundary Board was held in the County Court room with all members present.

The votes were canvassed on the elections held for the purpose of adding School District No. 5 to consolidated Union High School District No. 15, and also adding School District No. 144 to consolidated Union High School District No. 15, and were found to be as follows:

> School Dist. No. 144 ----- YES 34 --- NO 14 School Dist. No. 5 ----- YES 4 --- NO 9 Consolidated Union High No. 15 ---- YES 67 --- NO 9

Since the election carried in District No. 144 and consolidated Union High School District No. 15, School District No. 144 is now declared a part of consolidated Union High School District No. 15. Since the election lost in School District No. 5 for adding said district to consolidated Union High School District No. 15, that election is hereby declared lost.

Petitions were presented from Union High School Dist. No. 7, Thurston, and consolidated Union High School District No. 15, Springfield, requesting the Boundary Board to call an election in said districts for the purpose of voting on consolidating said two districts.

The petition from Union High School District No. 7 was examined and found to contain more than 5% of the legal voters in said Union High School District No. 7; and, the petition from consolidated Union High School District No. 15 was also examined and found to contain more than 5% of the legal voters in said consolidated Union High School District No. 15.

Whereupon, the following resolution was presented by C. M. Young, County Commissioner:

WHEREAS, a petition from Union High School District No. 7, Thurston, and a petition from consolidated Union High School District No. 15, Lane County, State of Oregon, has been presented to the District Boundary Board of Lane County, State of Oregon, and,

WHEREAS, each of said petitions have been duly examined and found to contain in excess of 5% of the legal voters in each of said districts, to-wit: Union High School District No. 7, Thurston, and consolidated Union High School District No. 15, Lane County, State of Oregon, and,

WHEREAS, said petitions were found to be in due and legal form as required by Section 35-3724 Oregon Code 1935 Supplement, and,

WHEREAS, Section 35-3724 Oregon Code 1935 Supplement provides

"That upon the filing of such petitions the District Boundary Board shall

set a date for the election thereon and shall notify the board of each of the Union High School Districts designated in the petitions".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the District Boundary Board of Lane County, State of Oregon, that an election be held on Tuesday, March 12, 1940, between the hours of 2:00 o'clock p.m. until 7:00 o'clock p.m. of said day for the purpose of voting upon the question of consolidating said Union High School District No. 7, Thurston, and said consolidated Union High School District No. 15, Lane County, State of Oregon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the Union High School building, Thurston, Lane County, State of Oregon, be designated as the voting place for the holding of said election in Union High School District No. 7, and the City Library in Springfield, Lane County, State of Oregon, be designated as the voting place for the consolidated Union High School District No. 15, Lane County, State of Oregon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the School Superintendent of Lane County, State of Oregon, give notice to the board of each of said districts, to-wit: Union High School District No. 7, Thurston, and consolidated Union High School District No. 15, Lane County, State of Oregon, of the date of said election, said notice to require each of said boards to cause their respective clerks to give legal notice to the voters of their respective districts that a vote will be taken in the district upon the question of the consolidation of said union high school districts.

No. 126 -- YES 18 -- NO 0 Since there was not a majority vote in School District No. 65, the election is hereby declared not carried.

The ballots were canvassed on the consolidation election held in School Districts No. 112 and 135, and were found to be as follows: School Dist. No. 112 -- YES 7 -- NO 4 School Dist. No. 135 -- YES 9 -- NO 8

Since there was a majority vote in each district, the election is hereby declared <u>carried</u>, and the consolidated district will be known as School District No. 112, and the school board and clerk of District No. 112 will serve as the school board and clerk of the consolidated district until the annual meeting in June, 1940.

The ballots were canvassed on the consolidation election held in School Districts No. 28 and 164, and were found to be as follows: School Dist. No. 28 --- YES 19 -- NO 0 School Dist. No. 164 -- YES 22 -- NO 18 Since there was a majority vote in each district, the election is hereby declared <u>carried</u>, and the consolidated district will be known as School District No. 28, and the school board and clerk of District No. 28 will serve as the school board and clerk of the consolidated district until the annual meeting in June, 1940.

Since the election carried in School Districts No. 28 and 164, it was not necessary for the Boundary Board to act on the petition to change territory from School District No. 164 to School District No. 28.

Petitions were read from Union High School District No. 3, Crow, and Union High School District No. 4, Elmira, requesting the Boundary Board to call a special meeting to vote on the question of consolidating said two Union High School districts. Both petitions were checked and found to be in order and signed by a sufficient number of legal voters, and upon motion duly passed by the Board, the County Superintendent was instructed to send notices to the clerk of each district, requesting the board of each district to call a special election for March 8th, the pobls to be open from 2 until 7 o'clock p.m.

Petitions were also read from the Elmira Union High School district and School District No. 118, requesting the Boundary Board to call a special meeting to vote on the question of adding District No. 118, to Union High School District No. 4, Elmira. These petitions were checked and found to be in order and signed by a sufficient number of legal voters, and the Boundary Board requested the School Board of each district to call a special election on March 8th, at 7:30 o'clock p.m. in School District No. 118, and from 2 until 7 in Union High School District No. 4, to vote on the proposition.

Petitions were read from School Districts No. 65 and 126, signed by a specifient number of legal voters, requesting the Boundary Board to call an election in each of said districts for the purpose of voting on consolidating said districts for grade school purposes. The County School Superintendent was authorized to request the board of each district to call a special election for March 1st at 7:30 o'clock p.m., to vote on the proposition.

The ballots were canvassed on the consolidation election held in School Districts No. 67, 71, 74, 81, and 132, and were found to be as follows: School Dist. No. 67 --- YES 26 -- NO 38 School Dist. No. 71 --- YES 27 -- NO 0 School Dist. No. 74 --- YES 10 -- NO 0

School Dist. No. 81 --- YES 5 -- NO School Dist. No. 132 -- YES 35 -- NO 🗧 Since there was not a majority of votes cast in all districts, the election is hereby declared not carried.

Petitions were read from School Districts No. 71, 74, 81, and 132, signed by a sufficient number of legal voters, requesting the Boundary Board to call an election in each of said districts for the purpose of voting on consolidating said four districts for grade school purposes. The County School Superintendent was authorized to request the board of each district to call a special election for February 29th at 7:30 o'clock p.m., to vote on the proposition.

Petitions were read from School Districts No. 79 and 144, signed by a sufficient number of legal voters, requesting the Boundary Board to call an election in each of said districts for the purpose of voting on consolidating said two districts for grade school purposes. The County School Superintendent was authorized to request the board of each district to call a special election. for February 29th at 7:30 o'clock p.m., to vote on the proposition.

Petitions were read from School Districts No. 10, 108, 110, and 136, signed by a sufficient number of legal voters, requesting the Boundary Board to call an election in each of said districts for the purpost of voting on consolidating said four districts for grade school purposes. The County School Superintendent was authorized to request the board of each district to call a special election for February 29th, at 7:30 o'clock p.m., to vote on the proposition.

A special meeting of the Lane County District Boundary Board was held in the County Court House, Eugene, Lane County, Oregon, on the 8th day of February, 1940, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock a.m. of said day, there being present Clinton Hurd, County Judge and Chairman, C. M. Young, County Commissioner, W. J. Holland, County Commissioner, and L. C. Moffitt, County School Superintendent and Ex-officio Secretary, constituting all of the members of the District Boundary Board.

The meeting was called to order by Clinton Hurd, Chairman, who announced that the purpose of the meeting was to consider petitions filed by legal voters in school District No. 5 and school district No. 144 and legal voters residing in consolidated Union High School District No. 15, Lane County, Oregon, requesting that the boundaries of consolidated Union High School District No. 15 be changed by adding school districts No. 5 and 144.

After examining the said petitions, which were duly marked and filed February 8, 1940, the District Boundary Board found said petitions to be signed by at least ten per cent (10%) of the legal voters residing in the consolidated Union High School District No. 15, and the petitions from each of the regular school districts proposed to be united signed by ten (10) legal voters or not more than one-third of the legal voters residing in their respective districts, to-wit: school districts No. 5 and 144.

And it further appearing that said petitions were in due and legal form as required by Section 35-217, Oregon Code Annotated.

Whereupon, the following resolution was presented by W. J. Holland:

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WHEREAS, a petition signed by at least ten per cent (10% of the legal voters residing in consolidated Union High School District No. 15, and a petition signed by ten legal voters and not more than one-third of the legal voters residing in school district No. 5, and a petition signed by ten legal voters or not more than one-third of the legal voters residing in School district No. 144, asking to have the boundaries of consolidated Union High School District No. 15 changed by adding the aforesaid school districts No. 5 and 144, have been filed, and

WHEREAS, said petitions have been duly examined and found to be signed as aforesaid and as required by Section 35-3717, Oregon Code Annotated, and,

WHEREAS, said petitions were filed on February 8, 1940, with the District Boundary Board of Lane County, State of Oregon, and have been checked by said District Boundary Board and found to be legal and signed by a sufficient number of legal voters in each of said districts respectively.

NOT THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That the District Boundary Board

of Lane County, State of Oregon, order the respective school boards of the aforesaid districts to submit the question of changing the boundaries of Union High School District No. 15 by adding districts No. 5 and 144, said elections to be conducted by the regular school boards of each of said districts, and to be held at the school house of districts Nos. 5 and 144, and at the City Library, Springfield, Lane County, State of Oregon, in consolidated Union High School District No. 15, on the 20th day of February, 1940, at 7:30 o'clock P.M. of said day in districts Nos. 5 and 144, and between the hours of 2:00 o'clock and 7:00 o'clock P.M. in consolidated Union High School District No. 15.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the notice of said election, clearly stating that the question of changing the boundaries of consolidated Union High School District No. 15, by adding districts Nos. 5 and 144, will be voted upon at said special election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the notices of said election be prepared by the secretary of the District Boundary Board and be, substantially, in the following form, to-wit:
