Students spend a substantial amount of time with online instruction (e.g. Teen Biz reading/writing program). Students get reading and math daily plus rotation of social studies, science, arts and PE. Many examples of project based learning are in evidence. There is a wide scope of instructional options including significant opportunities for arts and crafts, music, industrial arts and outdoor pursuits.
